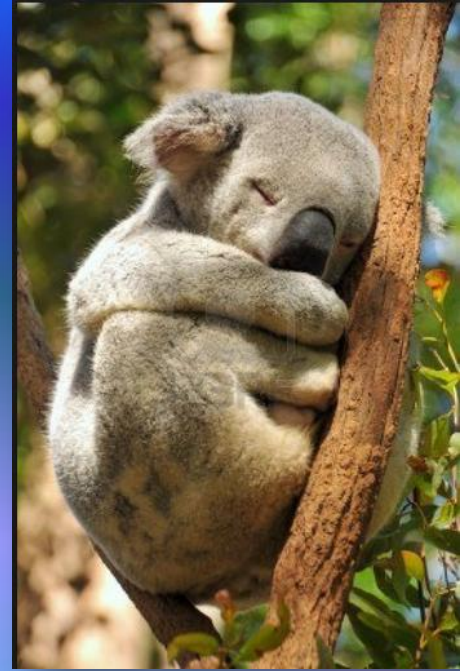

Koala



- ko·a·la [*koh-ah-luh*]

Definition: Koala- a sluggish, tailless, gray, furry, arboreal marsupial, usually found in Australia

Origin: 1800-10 erroneous spelling from the earlier *koola*, *kulla*, *kula*

Biology



- bi·ol·o·gy [bahy-ol-uh-jee]

Definition: The science of live or living matter in all its form and phenomena, especially with reference to origin, growth, reproduction, structure, and behavior

Origin: 1819, from Greek bios “life”. It was suggested earlier in 1802 by German naturalist Gottfried Reinhold Treviranus

Phenomenon

- Phe·nom·e·non [fi-nom-uh-non-nuh n]

Definition: a fact, occurrence, or circumstance observed or observable

Origin: 1595-1605 From Greek *phainomenon* “that which appears or seen”. First recorded in 1771
“extraordinary occurrence”

Dubiety

- du·bi·e·ty [doo-bahy-i-tee]

Definition: doubtful, a matter of doubt;

Also called dubiousity

Synonyms: skepticism, mistrust, distrust

Origin: 1750 from Late Latin dubius
meaning "*uncertainty*"

Breanna

- **Pronunciation: Briy-AE-N-aa**

It is a variant spelling of the Irish form Brianna

Ranked 307 in the United States

Breanna means “noble and honorable”

Origin: Irish and Scottish

The name Breanna is the feminine form of Brian

- **Common nicknames are: Bree, Breebs and Breebers**

Maegan

- Greek meaning of Maegan is “child of light”
- American meaning is “pearl”
- It also means strong and capable
- They say people with this name have a stable loving family and community and need to work with others to be appreciated
