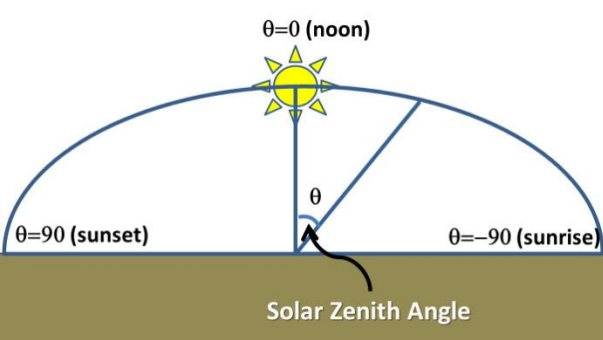

ZENITH (ze-nith)

- ✘ 1. the point on the celestial sphere vertically above a given position or observer. Compare nadir
- ✘ 2. a highest point or state; culmination.



ZENITH

- ✘ "point of the heavens directly overhead at any place," late 14centurey., from Old French cenith (Modern French zénith), from Medieval Latin cenit and senit.



TALISMAN (Tal-is-man)

- ✘ 1. a stone, ring, or other object, engraved with figures or characters supposed to possess occult powers and worn as an amulet or charm.
- ✘ 2. any amulet or charm.
- ✘ 3. anything whose presence exercises a remarkable or powerful influence on human feelings or actions.



TALISMAN

- ✘ 1630s, "magical figure cut or engraved under certain observances, "talisman, religious rite, payment," earlier "consecration, ceremony," originally in ancient Greek "completion,"
People used to carry talismans around for good luck or to repel evil beings that they thought haunted them. Also people sometimes wore a talisman to show they are interested in marrying someone



LEE

(lee)

- ✘ Lee is of an old English origin, and the meaning of lee is “pasture” or “meadow.” It is a Surname commonly used used in South America as a given name in honor to Robert E. Lee
