# AGGRESSION

- Hostile or violent behavior or attitudes toward another; readiness to attack or confront
- Pronunciation: ə'greʃHən
- Origin: Latin aggressiōn



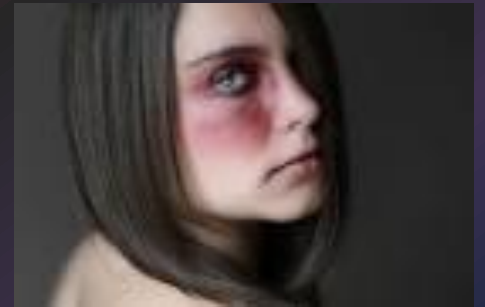
# VIOLENCE

- Rough or injurious physical force, action, or treatment
- **Pronunciation:** vahy-uh-luhns
- **Origin:** Middle English



# Abuse

- To treat in a harmful, injurious, or offensive way
- To use wrongly or improperly; misuse
- **Pronunciation:** uh-byooz; uh-byoos
- Many forms: physical, verbal, emotional, and mental
- **Origin:** late Middle English abusen



# pet

- Any domesticated or tamed animal that is kept as a companion and cared for affectionate
- **Origin:** perhaps back formation from pet  
lamb cade lamb, shortened variant of petty  
lamb little lamb



# Thought

The product of mental activity; that which one thinks: a body of thought.

**Pronunciation:** thawt

**Origin:** Middle English thoght, Old English



# Interest

- The feeling of a person whose attention, concern, or curiosity is particularly engaged by something
- **Pronunciation:** in-ter-ist, -trist
- **Origin:** Middle English < Medieval Latin

# Art

- The quality, production, expression, or realm, according to aesthetic principles, of what is beautiful, appealing, or of more than ordinary significance.
- **Pronunciation** :ahrt
- **Origin** :Middle English; Old English eart,





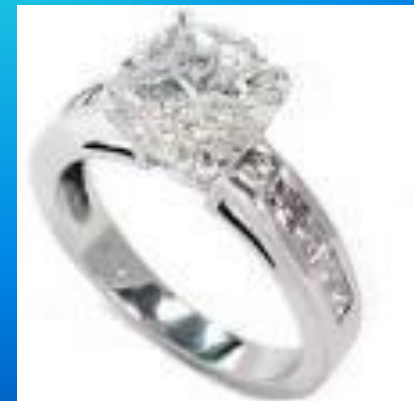
# Stiletto

- A small dagger with a slender tapered blade
- A sharply pointed tool used to make holes in leather, cloth, or other materials
- **Spike heel** , Also called: **stiletto heel** a very high heel on a woman's shoe, tapering to a very narrow tip
- **Pronunciation:** sti-let-oh
- **Origin :** Italian



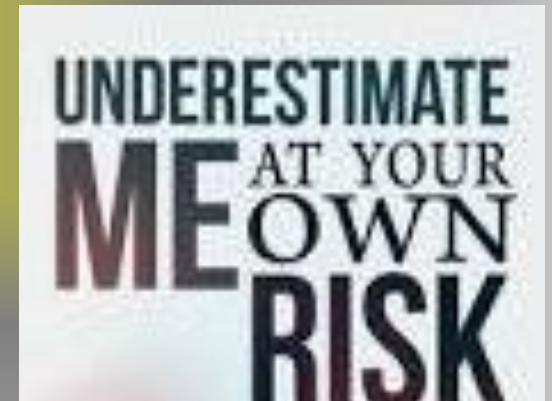
# Ring

- A typically circular band of metal
- Often set with gems, for wearing on the finger as an ornament, a token of betrothal or marriage
- **Origin** :Before 900; Middle English; Old English hring; cognate with Dutch, German ring, Old Norse hringr
