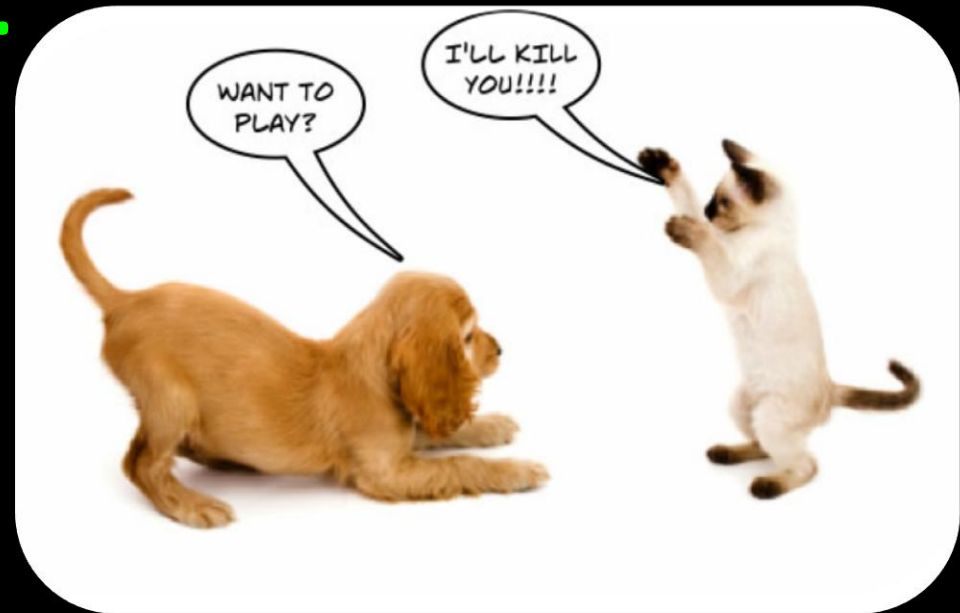

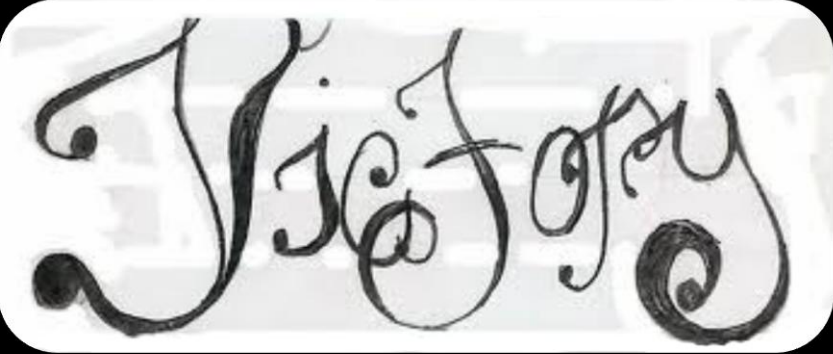

- Hooligan was first found in a British newspaper police-court report in the summer of 1898.
- It is from the changed form of the Irish family name Houlihan which was an Irish name in the music hall songs and newspapers of the 1880s and 90s.

- Used in the Italian, French, Slavic, Greek, Latin, and American languages, but they are all spelled in many different ways for each one.
