# Emery

- EM-ə-ree
- Noun- Emery
- The Normans introduced it to England, and though it was never popular, it survived until the end of the Middle Ages. As a modern given name, it is likely inspired by the surname *Emery*, which was itself derived from the medieval given name. It can also be given in reference to the hard black substance called emery.



# Katie

- KAY-tee
- Noun- Katie
- nickname for Catherine
- Means “getting ready for trouble”.
- Came from Germany, English, Australia



# Paper

- **pey**-per
- Noun- Paper
- Means- from Anglo-French *paper*, Old French *papier* "paper, document," from Latin *papyrus* "paper, paper made of papyrus stalks"



# Elephant

- **el**-uh-fuh nt
- Noun- Elephant
- Means- either of two large, five-toed pachyderms of the family Elephantidae, characterized by a long, prehensile trunk formed of the nose and upper lip, including *Loxodonta Africana* (African elephant)





# *Kitten*

- **key**-tee
- Noun- Kitten
- Means "little cat," from *chat* "cat," from Late Latin *cattus*
- *From France*
