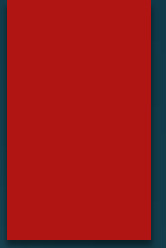

- ▶ Etymology- Latin (no specific year)
- ▶ Fearless



PAROXYSM

- ▶ Pronunciation: [par-uh k-siz-uh m]
- ▶ Function: noun
- ▶ Etymology- 1570-80; Greek
- ▶ Definitions-
- ▶ any sudden, violent outburst; a fit of violent action or emotion: paroxysms of rage.
- ▶ Pathology. a severe attack or a sudden increase in intensity of a disease, usually recurring periodically.



DRACONIAN

- ▶ Pronunciation: [drey-**koh**-nee-uh n, druh-]
- ▶ Function: adjective
- ▶ Etymology- 1810-20; Latin
- ▶ Definition-
- ▶ of, relating to, or characteristic of Draco or his code of laws.
- ▶ (often lowercase) rigorous; unusually severe or cruel:



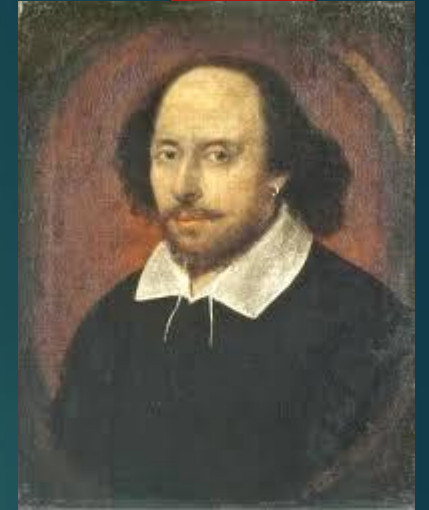
PULCHRITUDE

- ▶ Pronunciation: [puhl-kri-tood, -tyood]
- ▶ Function: noun
- ▶ Etymology- 1350-1400; Middle English/ Latin
- ▶ Definition- physical beauty; comeliness.

- ▶ Pronunciation: WIL-ee-əm ,or WIL-yəm
- ▶ Etymology- From the Germanic name Willahelm
- ▶ Derived from wil "will, desire" and helm "helmet, protection".
- ▶ Famous Williams –
- ▶ William Wallace- Scottish hero,
- ▶ William Tell- Swiss hero.
- ▶ William Shakespeare- dramatist/playwrite



Knake

- ▶ Pronunciation: kih-NAH-kee
- ▶ Etymology- Norwegian/ German
- ▶ crack, crackle, groan, moan
