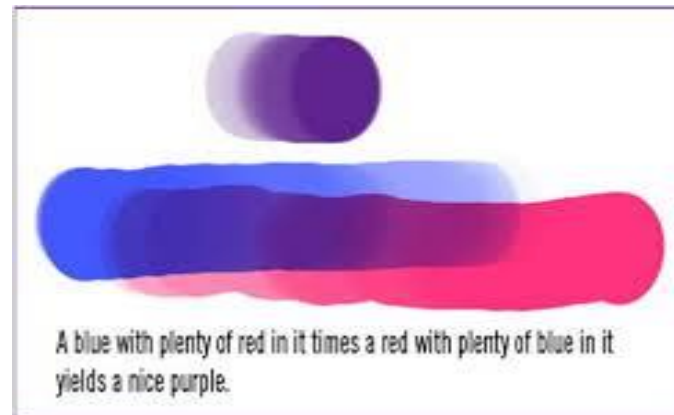


Purple- [pur-puh l]
