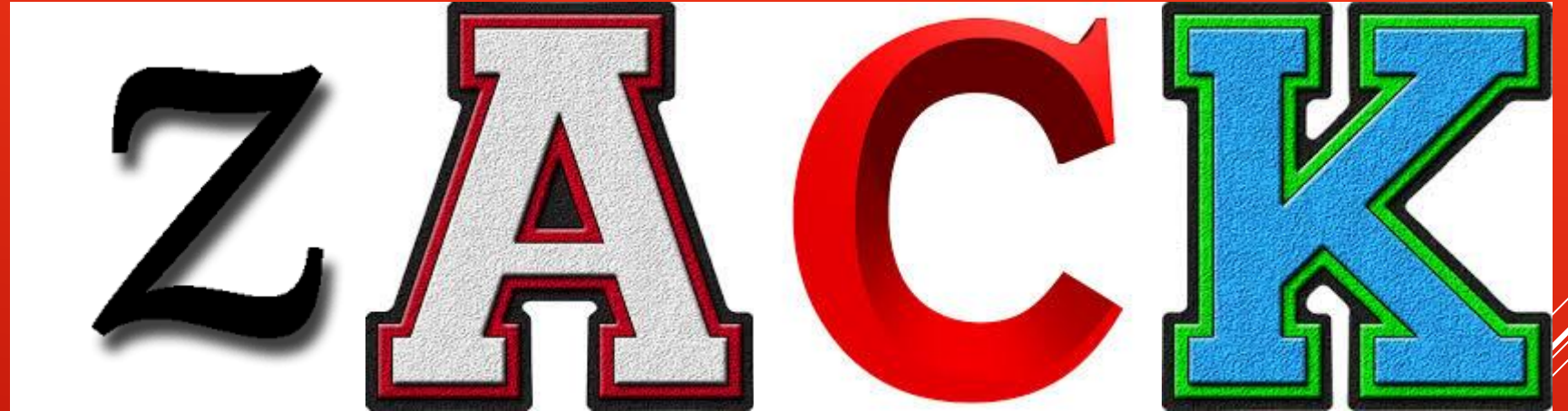

**USAGE:** English

**PRONOUNCED:** ZAK

**GENDER:** Masculine



**Originated:** English cognate of the Ecclesiastic Late Latin and Ecclesiastic Greek Zacharias

**Meaning-** "the Lord has remembered"

**Short for:** Zackary

# BRIAN

**GENDER:** Masculine

**USAGE:** Irish, English and Ancient Irish

**PRONOUNCED:** BRIE-ən

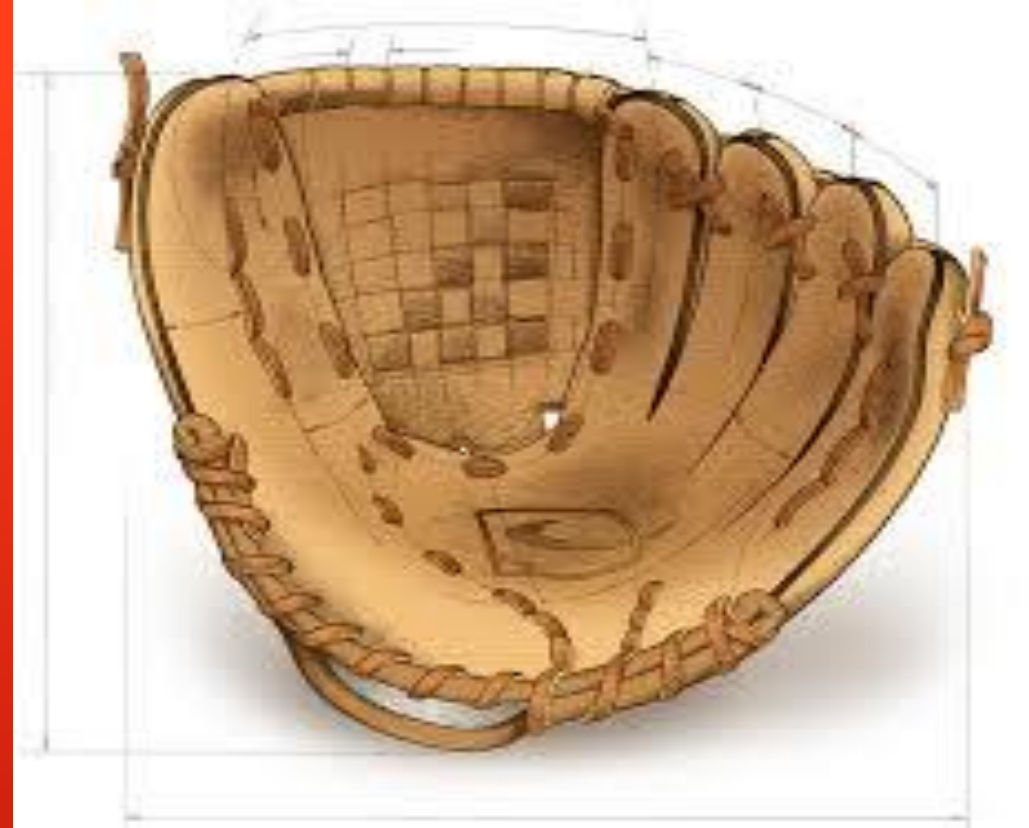
**MEANING:** not known for certain but it is possibly related to the Old Irish word "bri" by extension "high, noble"

**Ranked in the US:** Number 150

**It was borne by the semi-legendary Irish king Brian Boru, who thwarted Viking attempts to conquer Ireland in the 11th century**



# GLOVE



**Originated:** Old English glof

**PRONOUNCED:** /glʌv/

**Definition:** covering for the hand having separate sheaths for the fingers

**German Handschuh usual word for glove is: “Hand-Shoe”**

# TABLE

**Originated:** from Old French table and first recorded c. 1300

**PRONOUNCED:** /'teɪbl/

**Definition:** piece of furniture with the flat top and legs

**Usual Latin word for this was:** mensa
