There is no pronunciation for speed



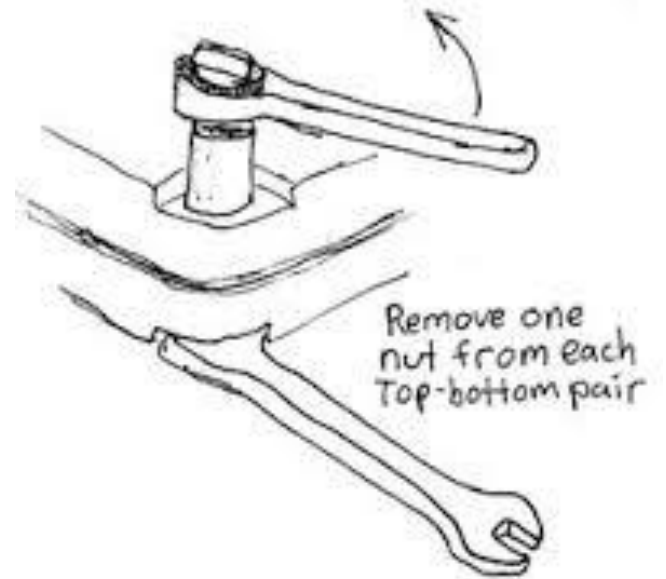
Torque

Something that produces or tends to produce rotation; the moment of a force or system of a forces tending to cause rotation

To overcome turning resistance

Pronounced tawrk

It originated from Latin in 1884 meaning to twist



Race

A contest in speed in which the fastest person wins

It originated in 1250 – 1300 in Middle English meaning a running race

A race can be swimming, running, driving, or sailing

There can be more than two people in a race

Pronunciation is reys



Codey KO-dee
