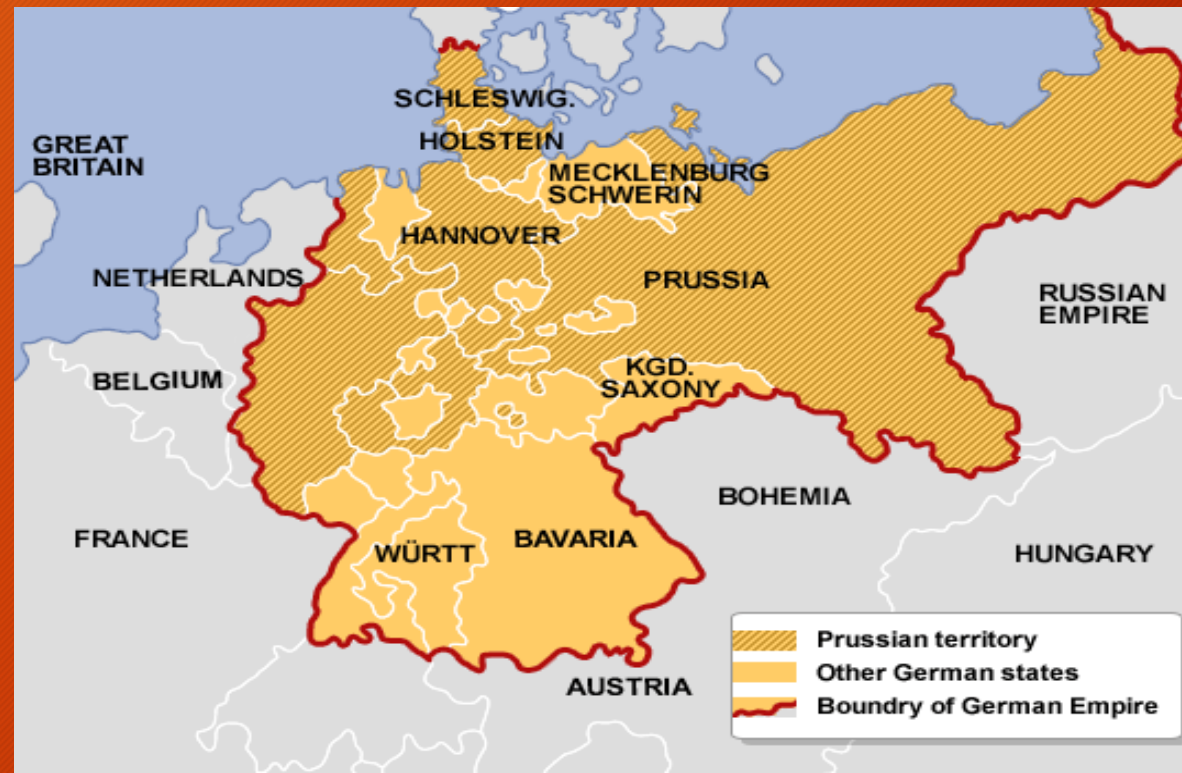
Samurai sam-oo-rah-y

Showalter

- Showalter is a surname common in the United States, and is possibly an anglicized variant of the German Schulter ("shoulder"). A more likely source is from the German words schön wald, ("pretty forest"), referring to one who lived in such a place: a Schönwalder.
- Its origin was in Prussia
