- Origin: Dutch for Huis, German for Haus, Old English for Hus

Function: noun



- I. Australian city, founded in 1788 and named for British Home Secretary Thomas Townshend.
- 2.A male or female given name


SYDNEY

Function: Noun



- I.A state in the Southeast United States
- 2.A republic in Southwest Asia on the Black Sea

GEORGIA

- Etymology: The state was named in 1732 and Georgia (the country) was occupied by the Soviet Union in 1921.
- Origin: Russian fro Grusia, Persian for Gurz
