# CAT



[kat]

Function: Noun

1. A small domesticated carnivore, bred in a number of varieties
2. Any of several carnivores of the family Felidae, as the lion, tiger, leopard, or jaguar

# CAT

- Etymology: The word *cat* comes from West Germanic meaning an Old English Catt in Century 700.
- Origin: Latin for Cattus, Dutch for Kat, German for Kazza.

# HOUSE

[hous] [houz]

Function: noun, adjective, or verb



1. A building in which people live, residence for human beings
2. A household

# HOUSE

- Etymology: The word *house* comes from Old English in Circa 1000
- Origin: Dutch for Huis, German for Haus, Old English for Hus

# SYDNEY

[sid-nee]

Function: noun



1. Australian city, founded in 1788 and named for British Home Secretary Thomas Townshend.
2. A male or female given name



# SYDNEY

- Etymology: Sydney the city was founded in 1788
- Origin: Old English for Sid
- Sydney is ranked 49<sup>th</sup> in the United States as of 2015.

# GEORGIA



[jawr-juh]

Function: Noun

1. A state in the Southeast United States

2. A republic in Southwest Asia on the Black Sea

# GEORGIA

- Etymology: The state was named in 1732 and *Georgia* (the country) was occupied by the Soviet Union in 1921.
- Origin: Russian from *Grusia*, Persian for *Gurz*
