- 2. Sums of money

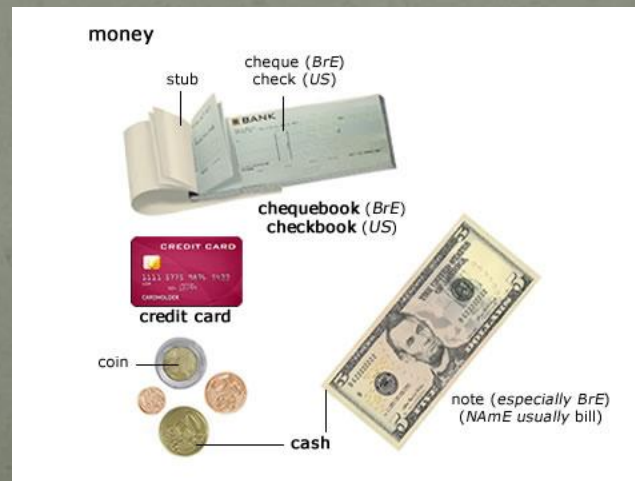


Money
