- possessing or exhibiting energy

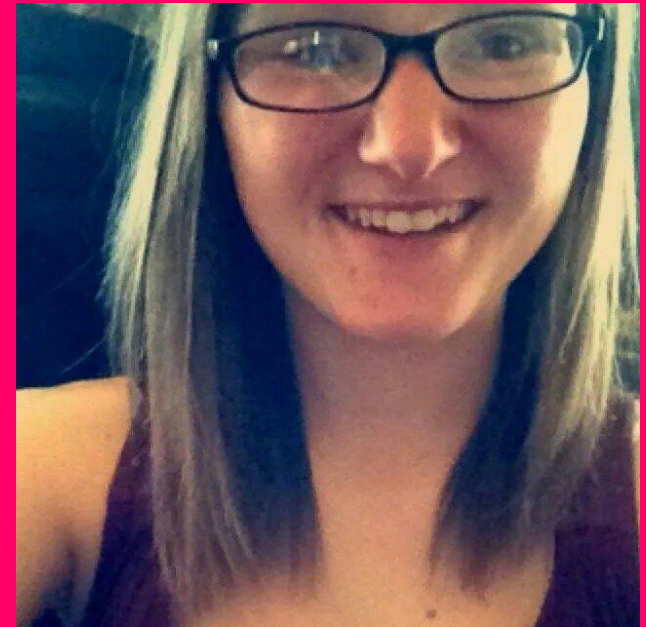
[en-er-jet-ik]
