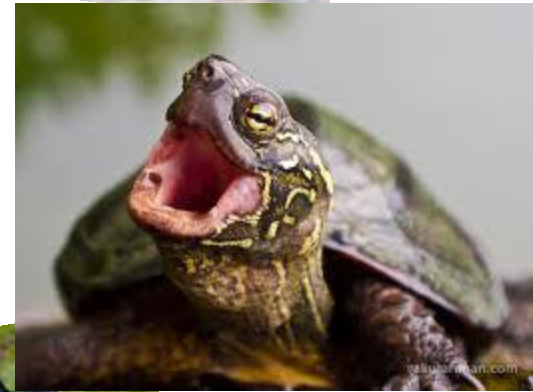

It means “Heaven”



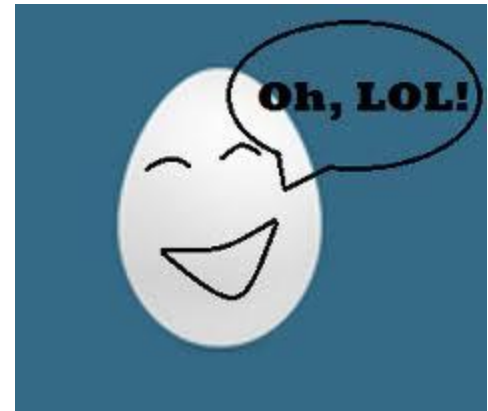
2. Turtle (tûrtəl)

- From Abdera, in Thrace, whose citizens were of simple foolishness who laughed at anything or anyone they didn't understand.



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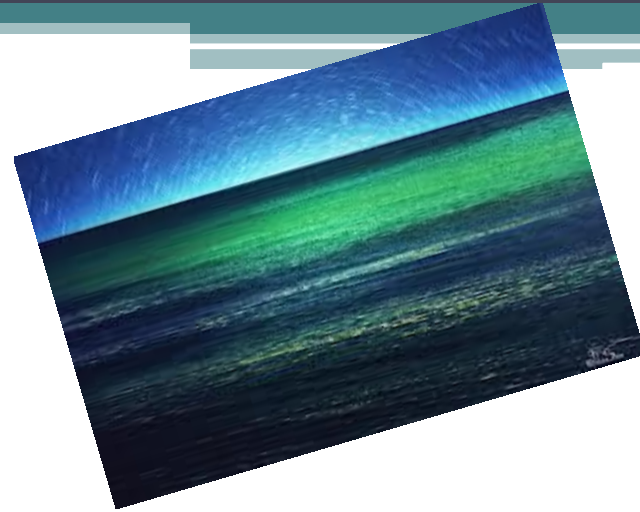


Haley (HAY-lee)

- In the middle ages, the name Haley was often recorded under several different spelling variations since they had little literacy and went off of sound.



Marie (mah-ree)



- Feminine
- It has a French, Danish, English, German, Czech, and Norwegian origin
- It came from the name Maria and Mary
- Its ranked 598 in the US and 4 in Belgium
- It's a very common name In England.
- It means “star of seas”
- It became popularized from the bible.

Gilmore (gil-more)

- It has an Irish and Gaelic origin
- Its meaning is “servant”
- The evolution of Gilmore starts with its early ancestors. Even in the earliest days of a name there are variations in that single name simply because last names were infrequently written down back when few people could write.
