- Variants of the name: Maddison, Madisyn, Madyson and Madison
- Diminutives: Maddie, Maddy, Maddi
- Madison is the 8th most popular name in the US.

MICHELLE

Origin: French The name Michelle is the 144th most popular name in the US •Variants of the name: Michele(French) • Diminutives: Micheline (French), Chelle, Shell, Michelyne (English)

HAYES



Pronunciation: Hayz


- ● 100th most common last name in America as of 1990.
- The Origin: Ireland, England and Scotland
- The first record of the last name Hayes was in 1197, in Ireland, but it was spelled <u>Heise.</u>
- The name Hayes means O hAoda with is the descendant of Aodh ("fire"), or of Aed, an Irish mythological god.
- Other ways to spell it: Hays, Heas, Heyes, Highes, Hease, Hayz and Heise




