



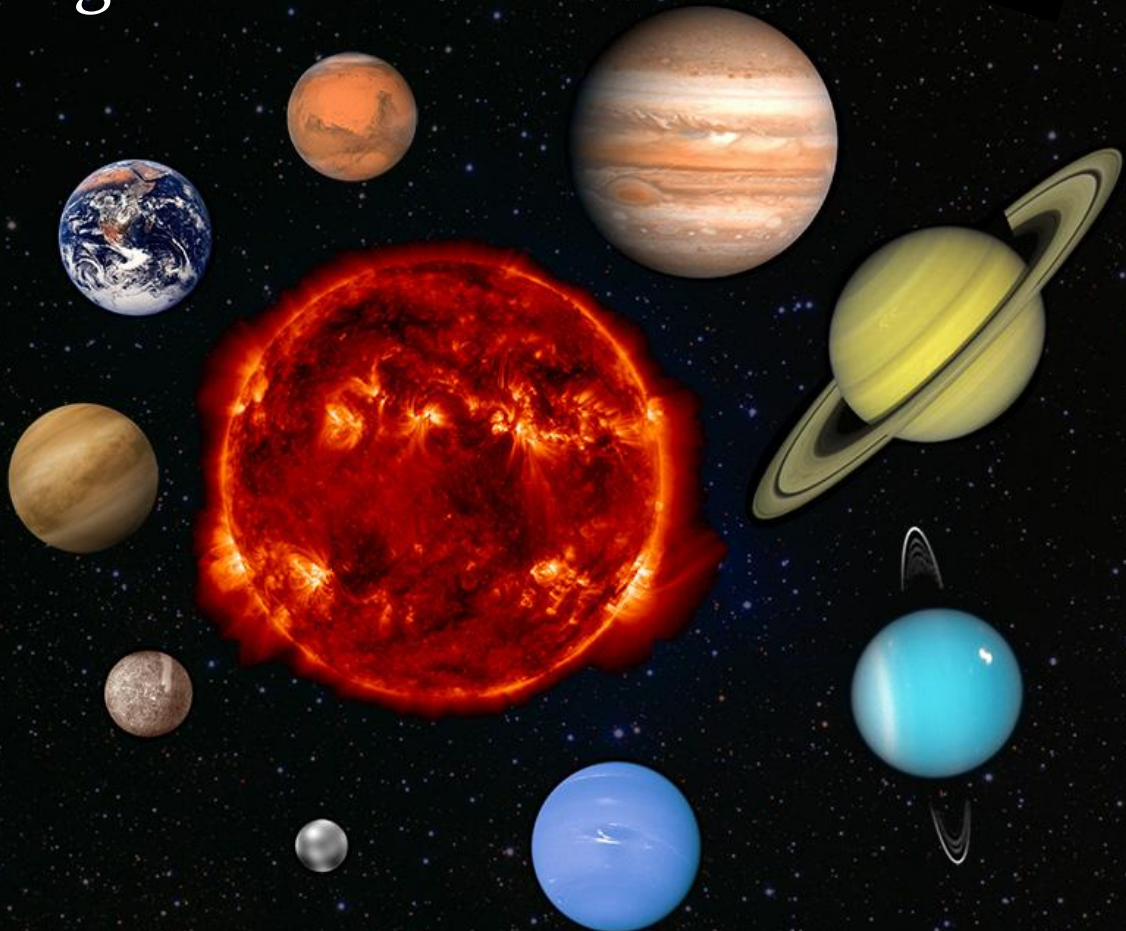

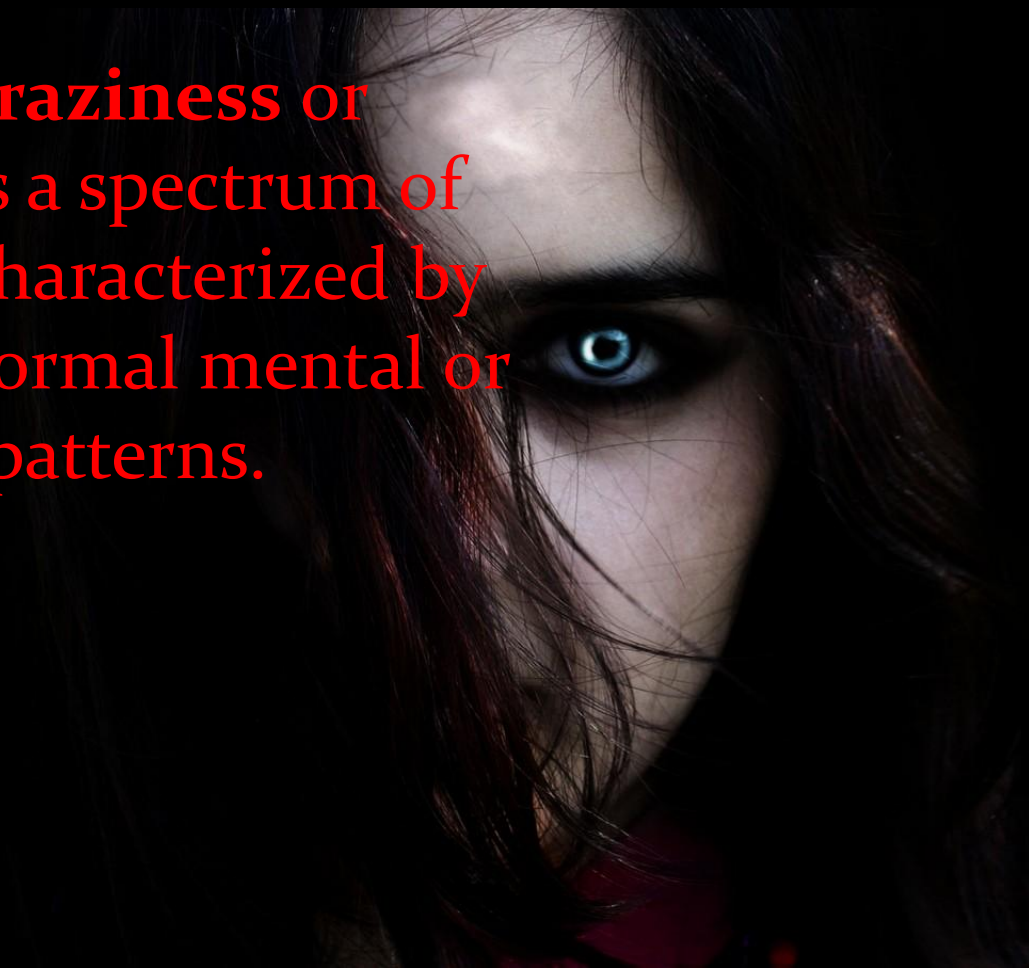

/in'sanitē

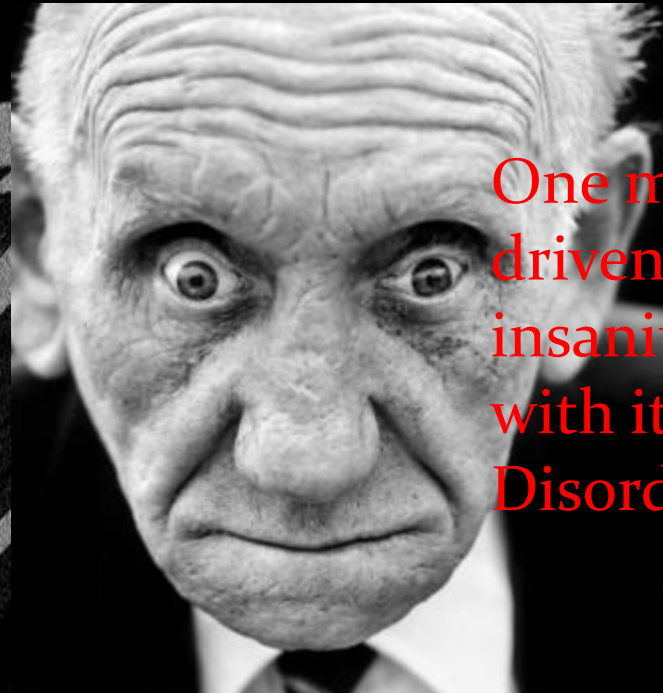
Insanity, craziness or madness is a spectrum of behaviors characterized by certain abnormal mental or behavioral patterns.

The state of being seriously mentally ill; madness.

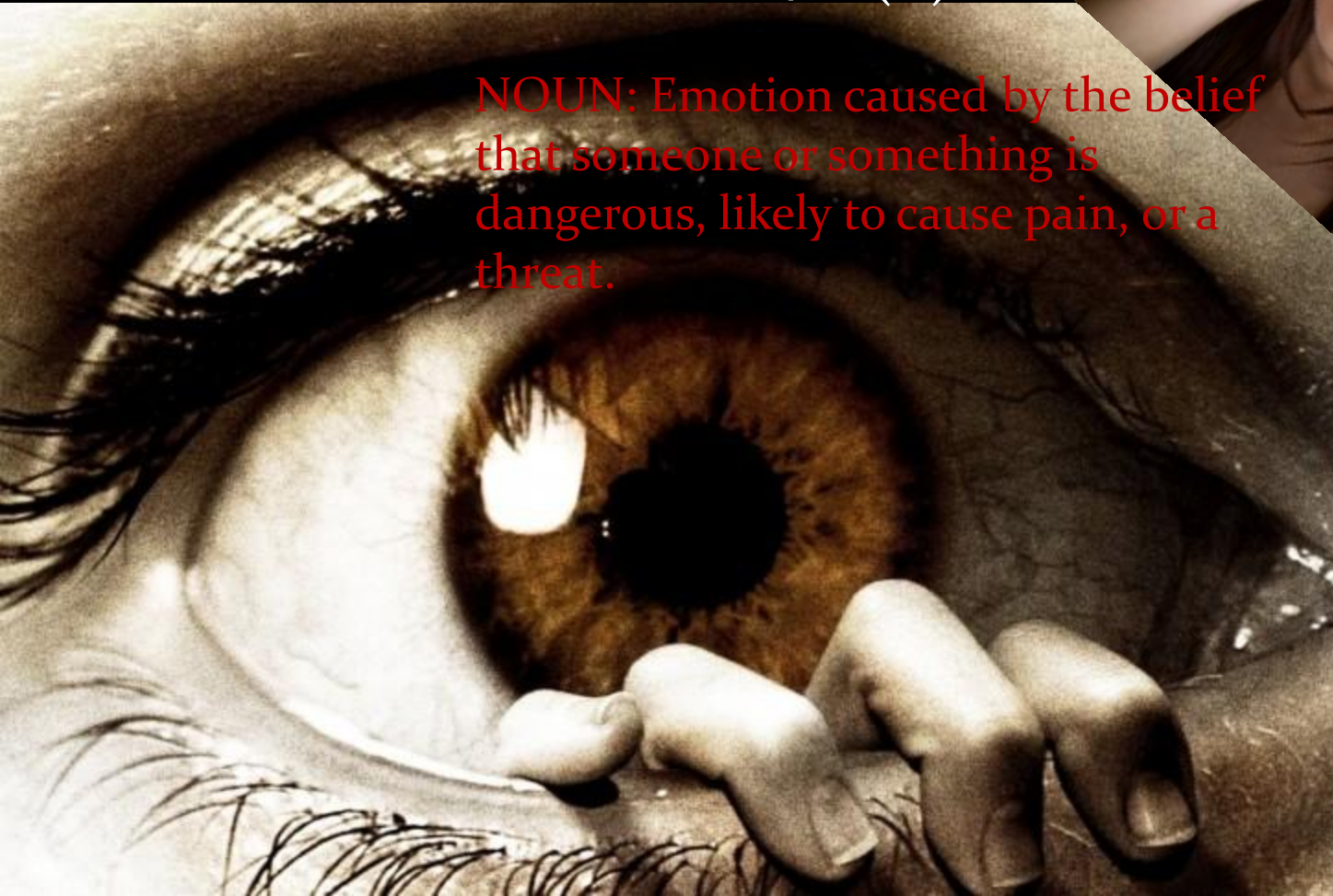


One may be driven to insanity, or born with it. (Mental Disorder)
