- ▶ *Origin:*
1930–1935; < Mexican Spanish; Spanish: wadding, plug, probably of expressive origin.
- ▶ Tortilla filled with spiced meat, etcetera
- ▶ 1949, from Mexican Spanish, "light lunch," literally "plug, wadding."



Tacos (tah-koh)

- ▶ Mexican Cookery. an often crisply fried tortilla folded over and filled, as with seasoned chopped meat, lettuce, tomatoes, and cheese.

- ▶ English: French feminine diminutive form of Jacques.(=James)
- ▶ German: A female given name borrowed from French.
- ▶ French: Feminine gender.
- ▶ Means Sup planter.
- ▶ Deep artistic, and creative side, shown through the love of music and literature.
- ▶ Proper noun
