- ▣ French
- ▣ Noun

- ▣ tortoise, from the early 1600s, originally "marine tortoise," from French *torture*, *torture* 13th century "turtle, tortoise" (often associated with diabolical beasts), of unknown origin.

- ▣ The English word perhaps is a sailors' mauling of the French one, influenced by the similar sounding turtle

- ▣ #2. Later extended to land tortoises; *sea-turtle* is attested from 1610s

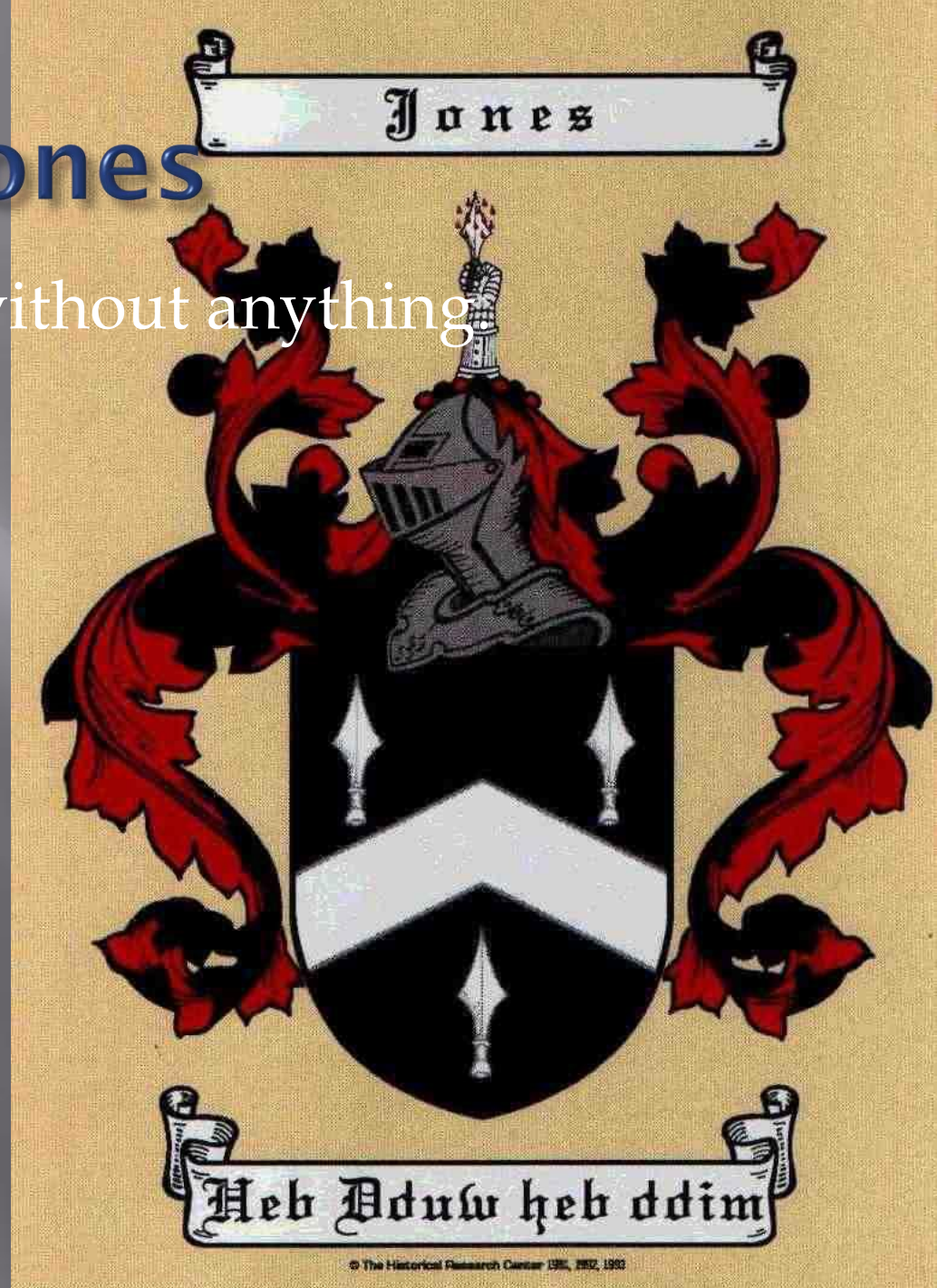
