- Its first known use was in the 14th century.

Smile

- Noun
- First known use was in 1838
- The word Poster comes from the word post

Poster



- 1.a placard or bill posted or intended for posting in a public place, as for advertising.
- 2.a person who posts bills or placards.
- 3.a large printed picture, used for decoration



Cori



- Origin: English
- Pronounced: KAWR-ee
- The name Cori is very uncommon and is normally only used in the English language.
- Different variations of the name Cori have different meanings.
- Some meanings of Cori are maiden, from the round hill, seething pool, and ravine.

- Origin: French and Hebrew
- Pronounced: dan-YEL
- Meaning: God is my Judge
- The female version of Daniel
- Have only been used in the English speaking world since the 20th century.
