[muh-reen]

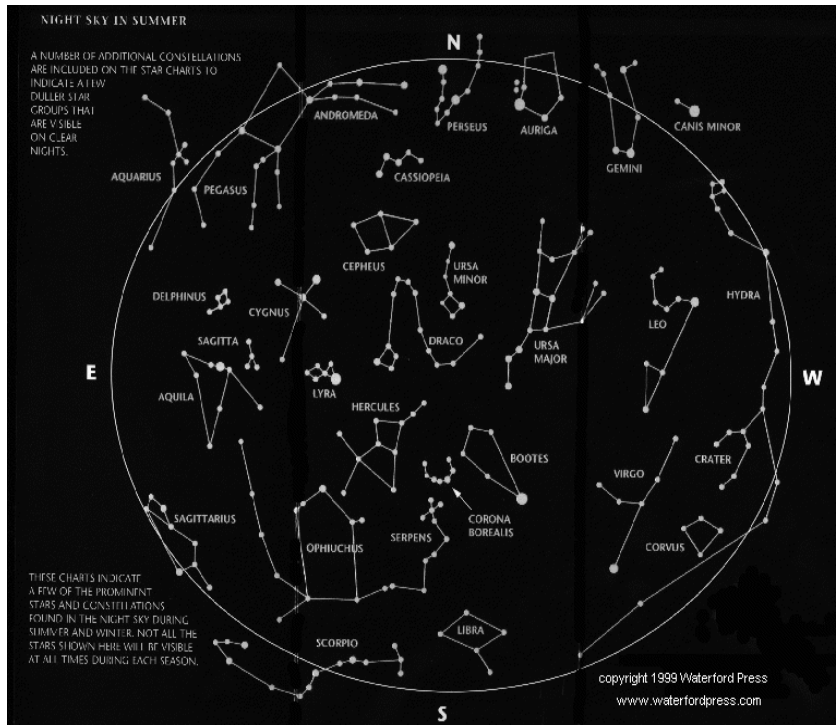
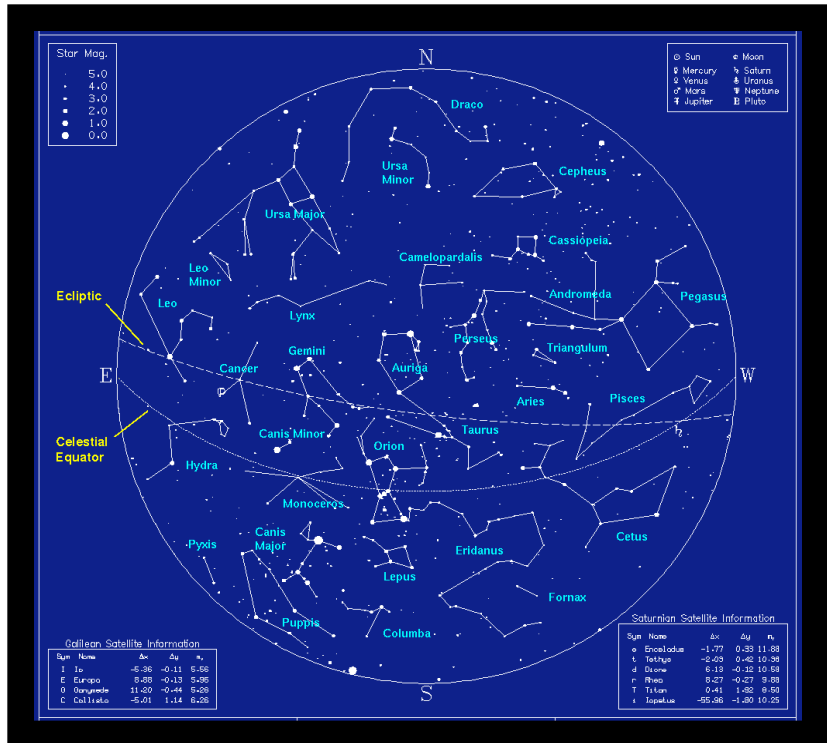
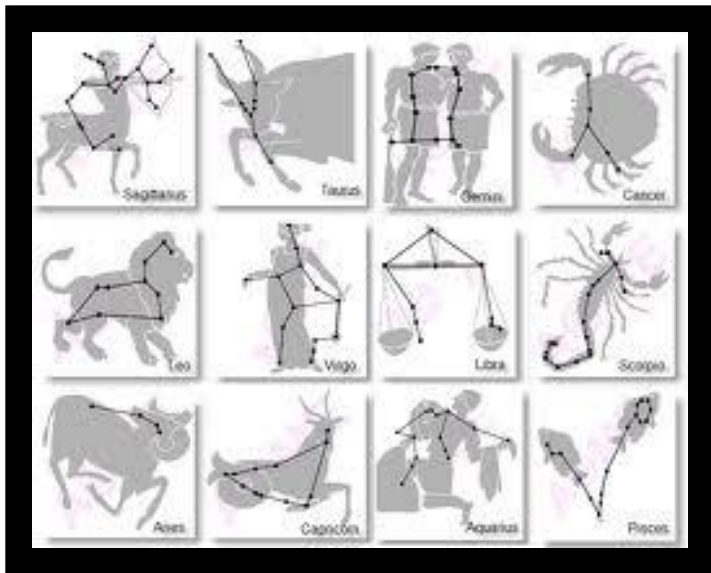
- Early 1500 century

[kon-stuh-ley-shuhn]

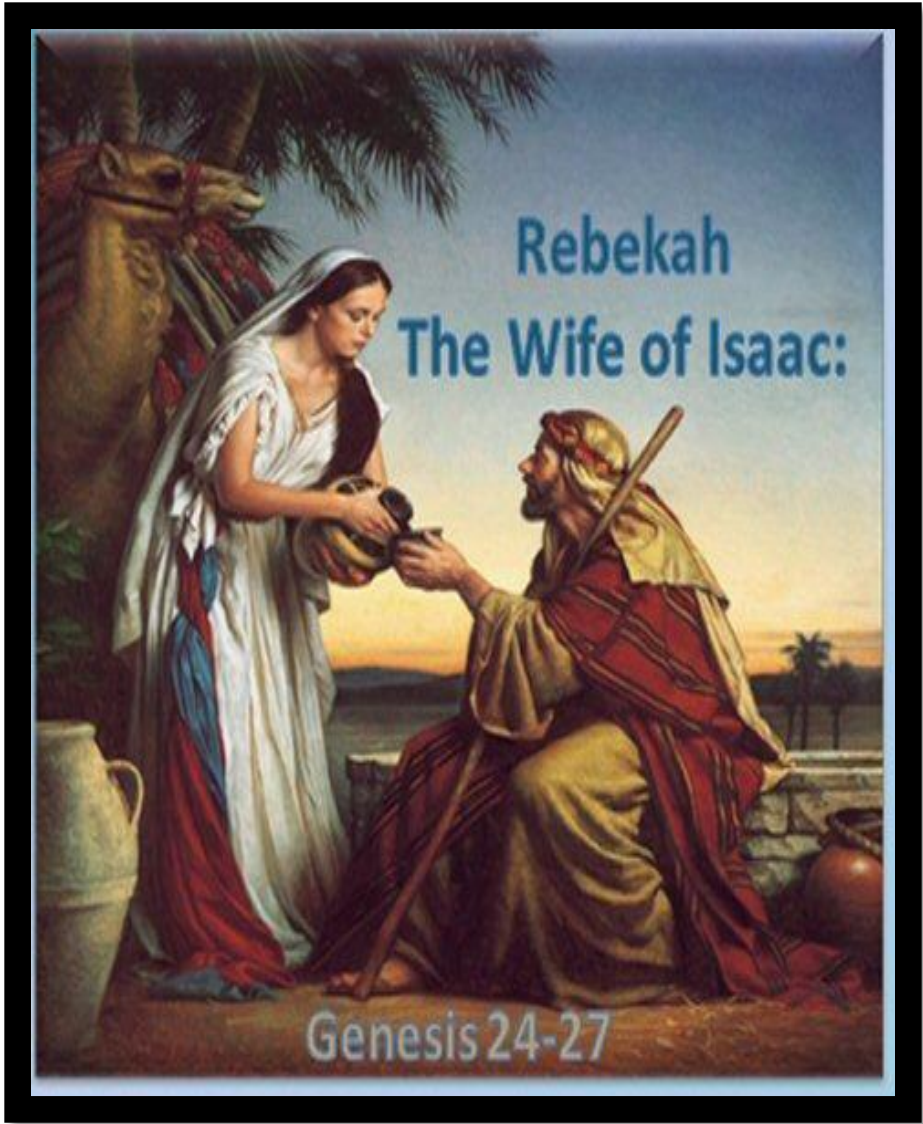
- Any of various groups of stars to which definite names have been given

Rebecca

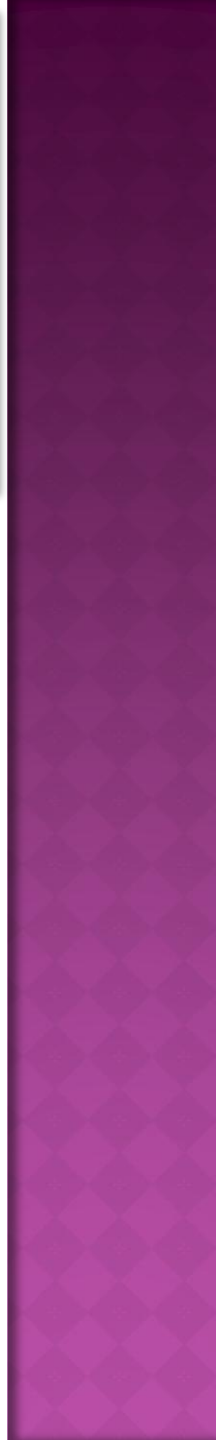
[Re-bec-ca]

SUE

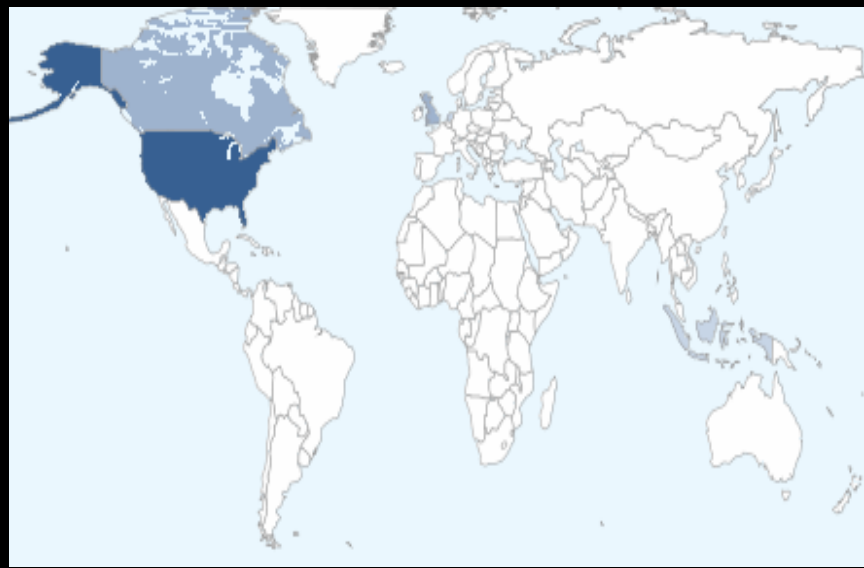
- The meaning of sue is lily or lotus
