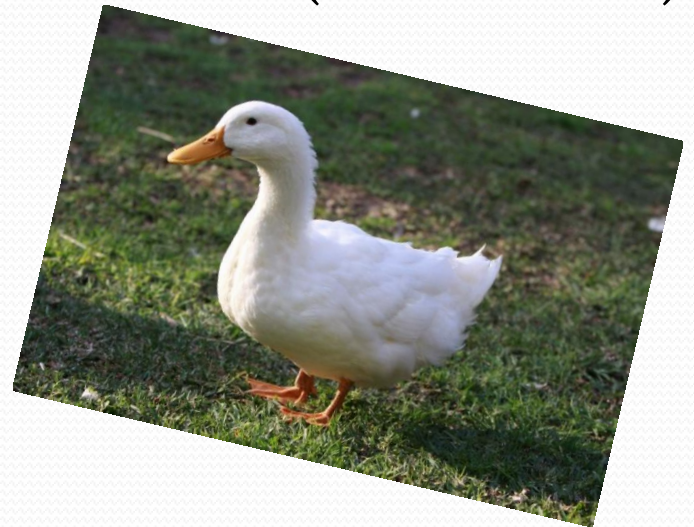

# Duck

- \ 'dæk \
- Noun
- From Middle English *dukken*
- From Old English *ducan, duccan* (“to duck”)
- An aquatic bird of the family Anatidae, having a flat bill and webbed feet



# Run

- \ 'rən \
- Verb
- From Middle English ronnen (“to run”)
- Act or instance of running, of moving rapidly using the feet



# Lynn

- Gender: Feminine
- Usage: English
- From an English surname which was derived from Welsh *llyn* "lake".
