else in any sort of group.*



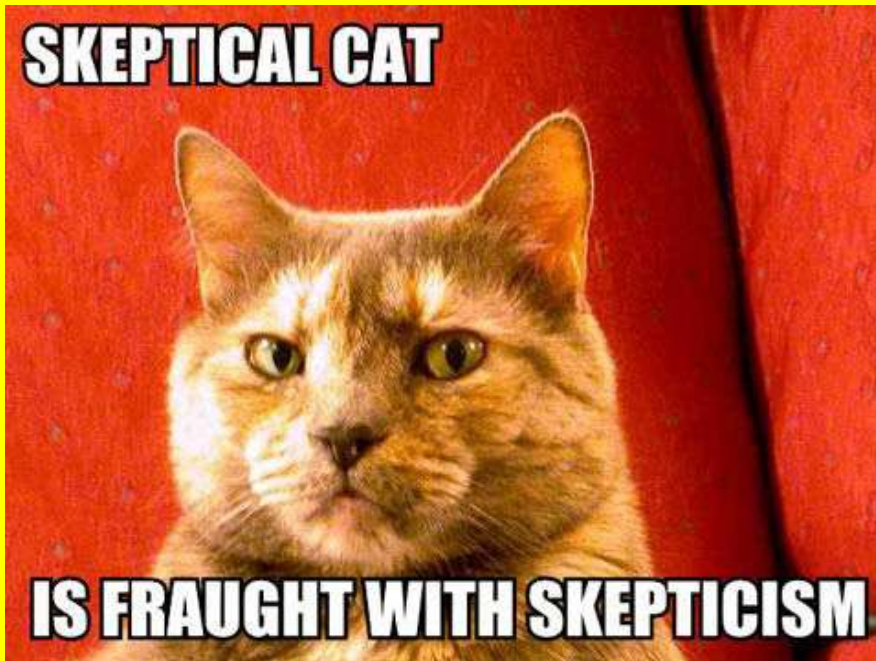
Skepticisms
