- Pronunciation: [jahr]
- Function: Verb
- Origin: It originated in the 1520s.
- Definition: To produce a harsh, grating sound.

- Pronunciation: Brr - 'on' - 'win'
- Origin: Welsh or English
- Meaning: Dark and pure
- Other ways to spell Bronwyn are Bronwen or Bronwin.
- The name Bronwyn is not very popular in America, but it is a very common name in Australia.
