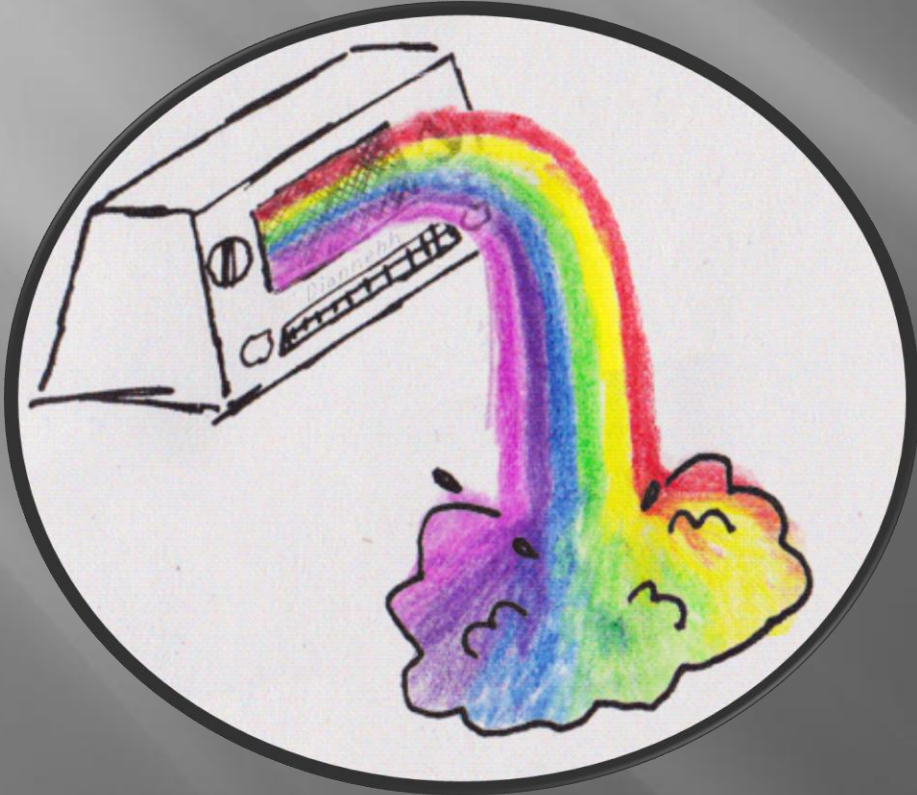

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# Music

- ▣ Pronounced as: [myoo-zik]
- ▣ An art of sound in time that expresses ideas and emotions through significant forms using rhythm, melody, harmony, and color.
- ▣ Origin: Middle English: from Old French *musique*.

# Drama

- ▣ Pronounced as: [**drah-muh**, **dram-uh**]
- ▣ The art dealing with the writing and production of plays or the quality of being dramatic.
- ▣ Origin: Early 16th century:late Latin from Greek *drama*, from *dran* 'do, act'.

# Taylor

- ▣ Pronounced as: [tey-ler]
- ▣ Origin: From an English surname which originally was considered as someone who was a tailor, from Norman French *tailleur*, ultimately from Latin *taliare* "to cut".
