Borrowing from Tradition: The Star Wars Trilogy

One of the most popular film series of all times is George Lucas's space trilogy, commonly known as the Star Wars adventures. Each of these three films—Star Wars (1977), The Empire Strikes Back (1980), and Return of the Jedi (1983)—attracted millions of viewers when first released in the theaters. Today, the films find new audiences through videotape, and millions more fall under the spell of Princess Leia, Luke Skywalker, Han Solo, and Chewbaca. One of the reasons the Star Wars saga is so popular is that it borrows the best elements from our storytelling heritage. In other words, it has the characteristics of our best epics, myths, legends, and romances.

In the following exercises, you will have the opportunity to expand your vocabulary by reading about the Star Wars series. Below are ten vocabulary words that will be used in these exercises.
