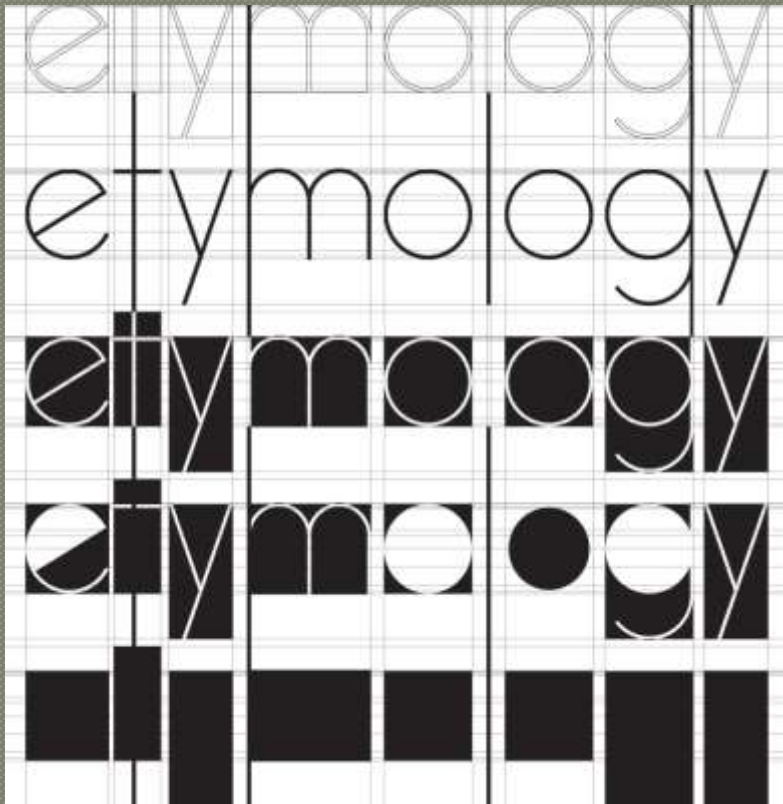

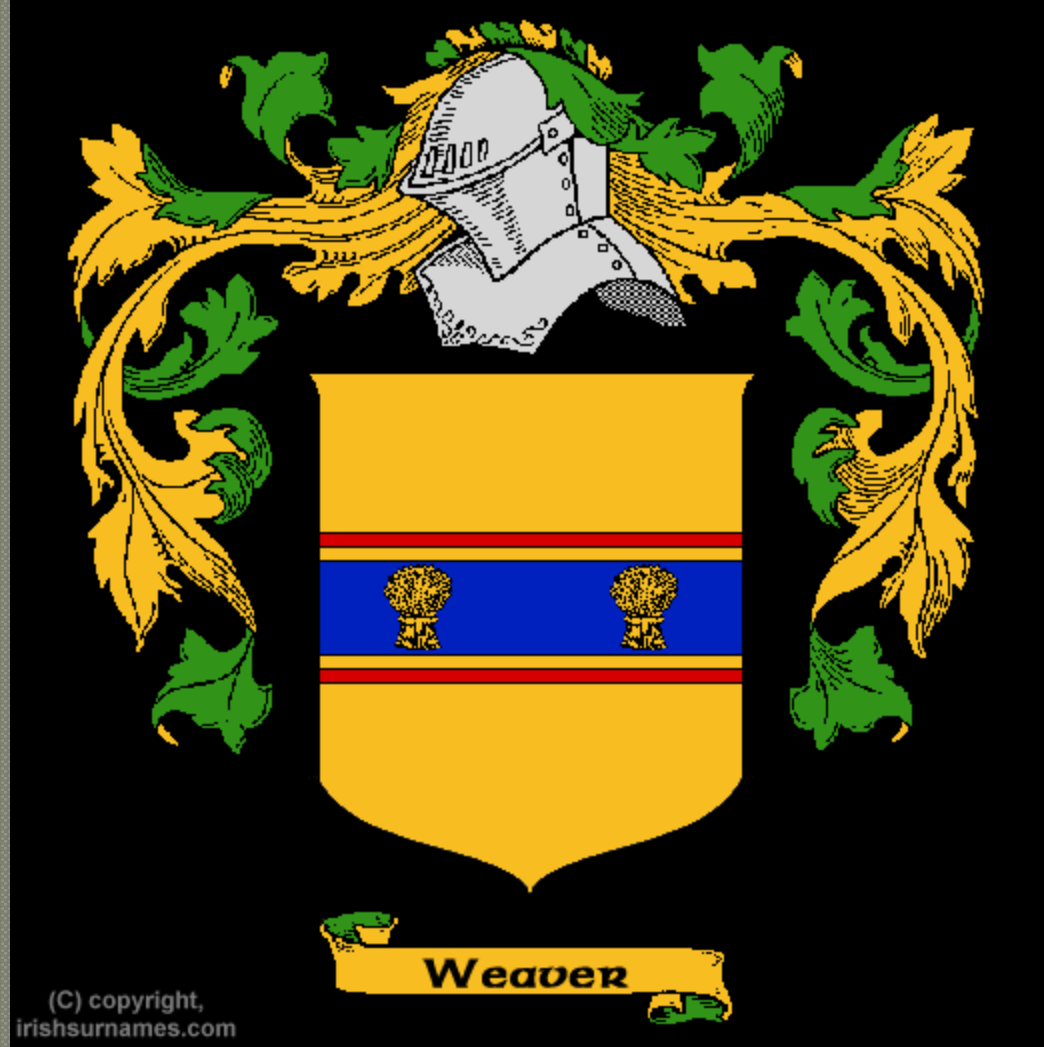

## Tractor

1856, "something that pulls," earlier used of a quack device consisting of two metal rods which were supposed to relieve rheumatism (1798, in full *Perkins's metallic tractor*), from Medieval Latin *tractor*, from stem of Latin *trahere* "to pull, draw



## WEAVER

The name Weaver was brought to England in the wave of migration that followed Norman conquest of 1066. It is the name for a weaver. The surname Weaver originally derived from the old English meaning person that weaves

from grizzle "gray". Grizzly  
bear is first recorded 1807
