

The Origin of Paradise


- Pronounced par-uh-dahys.
- Originates from the late 12th century.
- From the Old French word *paradis* and the Late Latin word *paradisus*.
- Both words refer to the biblical Garden of Eden.

- Originates from the late 14th century.
- From the Late Latin word *reflexionem* meaning surfaces or to bend back.
- Also from a stem of the Latin word *reflectere*, which also means to bend back.
- Both words refer to the bending of light on surfaces.



The Definition of Reflection

- Definition #1- The act of reflecting or the state of being reflected.
- Definition #2- An image or representation.
- Definition #3- A fixing of thoughts on something. (to reflect upon)


